

WINONA COUNTY ORDINANCE No. 7

The County Board of Winona County ordains:

No person shall park or leave standing any vehicle, whether attended or unattended, for a longer period than 48 consecutive hours on the following portions of County State Aid Highway No. 12:

Beginning at the intersection of County State Aid Highway No. 12 and Third St. in Dresbach Township approximately 310 feet northwesterly of the southeast corner of Section 18, Township 105 North, Range 4 West, thence northwesterly along County State Aid Highway No. 12 for 4750 feet and there terminating.

A vehicle moved a distance less than 1 block during such period shall for the purpose of this section be deemed to have remained stationary.

As a means of notifying the public of the provisions of this ordinance the Winona County Highway Engineer is authorized and directed to paint and erect signs as per the standards on painting and the erection of signs which are contained in the Uniform Manual of Traffic Control Devices.

It is a petty misdemeanor punishable by a fine of not more than \$100 for any person to violate any provisions of this ordinance. A person charged with a violation of this ordinance is not entitled to a jury trial, but shall be tried by a judge without a jury. If convicted, he is not subject to imprisonment but may be punished by a fine of not more than \$100.00.

In addition, a peace officer is hereby authorized to move a vehicle to any public garage or other place of safety at the expense of the driver or owner or other person in charge of the vehicle when the vehicle has been parked or left standing in violation of this ordinance. A vehicle so removed shall be released to the driver or the owner or other person in charge of the vehicle only upon the payment of any reasonable charges made for towing and storage.

Commissioner Kobler, the following resolution was adopted by the  
Board of County Commissioners of Winona County, Minnesota in meeting duly assembled  
on the 3rd day of December, 1974 at the Court House in the City of Winona, Minnesota:

WHEREAS, the County of Winona has established County State Aid Highway  
No. 12 in Winona County;

WHEREAS, residents of what is commonly known as the City of Dresbach, Minnesota  
in the interests of safety and convenient public travel have requested that the  
County of Winona prohibit parking of vehicles for a longer period than 48 hours  
on the following portion of County State Aid Highway No. 12:

Beginning at the intersection of County State Aid Highway No. 12 and  
Third St. in Dresbach Township approximately 310 feet Northwesterly  
of the Southeast corner of Section 18, Township 105 North, Range 4  
West, thence Northwesterly along County State Aid Highway No. 12  
for 4750 feet and there terminating.

WHEREAS, the Winona County Highway Engineer has advised the Winona County  
Board of Commissioners to grant the request in the interests of safety and  
convenient public travel;

NOW THEREFORE, IT IS HEREBY RESOLVED That no person shall park or leave  
standing any vehicle, whether attended or unattended, for a longer period than  
48 consecutive hours on the following portions of County State Aid Highway No. 12:

Beginning at the intersection of County State Aid Highway No. 12 and  
Third St. in Dresbach Township approximately 310 feet Northwesterly  
of the Southeast corner of Section 18, Township 105 North, Range 4 West,  
thence Northwesterly along County State Aid Highway No. 12 for 4750  
feet and there terminating.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED That a vehicle moved a distance less than one block  
during such period shall for the purpose of this section be deemed to have remained  
stationary.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Winona County Highway Engineer is empowered  
and directed to place and maintain appropriate signs in the above described area  
which signs shall prohibit parking for a longer period than 48 consecutive hours.

# AFFIDAVIT OF PUBLICATION

foreman of the printer and the printer in charge of the Winona Daily News and has full  
knowledge of the facts herein stated as follows:

(1) Said newspaper is printed in the English language in newspaper format and in  
column and sheet form equivalent in printed space to at least 900 square inches.

(2) Said newspaper is a daily and is distributed at least six days each week, or five  
days in a week in which a legal holiday is included.

(3) Said newspaper has twenty-five percent of its news columns devoted to news  
of local interest to the community which it purports to serve and does not wholly  
duplicate any other publication and is not made up entirely of patents, plate matter  
and advertisements.

(4) Said newspaper is circulated in and near the municipality which it purports to  
serve, has at least 500 copies regularly delivered to paying subscribers, has an  
average of at least seventy-five percent of its total circulation currently paid or no  
more than three months in arrears and has entry as second-class matter in its local  
Post Office.

(5) Said newspaper purports to serve the City of Winona in the County of Winona  
and it has its known office of issue in the City of Winona in said county, established  
and open during its regular business hours for the gathering of news, sale of ad-  
vertisements and sale of subscriptions and maintained by the managing officer of  
said newspaper or persons in its employ and subject to his direction and control  
during all such regular business hours and at which said newspaper is printed.

(6) Said newspaper files a copy of each issue immediately with the Minnesota  
Historical Society.

(7) Said newspaper has complied with all the foregoing conditions for at least two  
years preceding the day or dates of publication mentioned below.

(8) Said newspaper has filed with the Secretary of State of Minnesota prior to  
January 1, 1966 and each January 1 thereafter an affidavit in the form prescribed by  
the Secretary of State and signed by the managing officer of said newspaper and  
sworn to before a notary public stating that the newspaper is a legal newspaper.
